Spiritual Paralysis

If there is anything we can see when we read about the miracles of Jesus, it's that they were always immediate and they were never rejected. It didn't matter if the person was blind, deaf, sick, paralyzed or even dead, when Jesus steps in and provides healing, the person is immediately made well. When Jesus first approaches a person, they didn't ever ask for Jesus not to heal them. Further, not only were they made well, but not one person that Jesus ever healed, ever came back to Jesus and wished he hadn't done it.

It would be very strange to reject the healing that Jesus can give wouldn't it? As silly as that might be, I'm afraid we do this when it comes to our own healing. We might not be blind, deaf, sick, or paralyzed in the physical sense but sometimes we are in the spiritual sense. And just like Jesus provided physical healing, he can provide spiritual healing. But do we reject it? The truth is sometimes we do and we are just spiritually paralyzed as a person who is physically paralyzed.

It's that sin we commit. You know, that one that we just can't seem to forgive ourselves for. Intellectually we know that Jesus has forgiven us but whatever reason we just can't seem to forgive ourselves.

Or what about when someone hurts us. You know, that thing that person did to us or said about us that you haven't forgiven them for. And even though they've asked for forgiveness and they've been forgiven by Jesus, for whatever reason, we just can't seem to let it go.

When this, happens we are spiritually paralyzing ourselves. When this happens, it's like we are rejecting the immediate healing that only Jesus can give. When Jesus wants to heal someone who is paralyzed, the paralytic never says, "Don't worry about Jesus. I'm perfectly happy the way I am." That person wants to be healed. They don't want to live like that. They don't want to carry that burden any longer.

So why do we? Does it really make sense to be paralyzed by shame and guilt because we can't forgive ourselves? Does it really make sense to be consumed with anger and bitterness towards someone because you can't forgive them? Perhaps the real question is, does it really make any sense to remained paralyzed, when Jesus has already provided healing?

What's keeping you from being healed? Do you need to forgive someone? Or do you need to forgive yourself? What is that sin you need to confess? What is that thing you need to let go of?

Jesus provides forgiveness and healing, and unless we fully embrace this, we will never live the full life he wants us to live.

May you know you are forgiven. May you forgive if you need to. May you be healed from your spiritual paralysis. ~ Brian
